Steve Noblett, Executive Director of Christian Community Health Fellowship

There are many misconceptions about people living in poverty. When we refer to them as “the poor” or “the uninsured”, we inadvertently reinforce stereotypes and images that are just not true. We serve neighbors...people with stories who enrich our lives and our communities when given the chance. The way we think about those who experience obstacles to care will determine how we communicate about our work to volunteers and donors, and will determine whether our patients feel valued or merely tolerated.

Learning to Speak the Language: The Christ Community Story

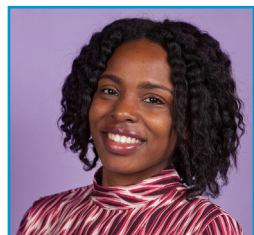
Reid Hebert, M.D., Director of Christ Community Health Coalition

In 2010, a group of people moved into Southwest OKC to plant Christ Community Church. As they began meeting their neighbors, they recognized that healthcare was a problem for many of them. Out of this realization and out of a love for the community, Christ Community Health Coalition was formed. In this session, Dr. Hebert will tell the story of Christ Community including their successes and failures, what they've learned, and how they are being changed by their neighbors.

Health Care Changes — Impact and Opportunity

Pam Rimmel, Executive Director of Health Alliance for the Uninsured

Pam will talk about the national policies and actions that impact individuals, families, providers, and companies in Oklahoma. She will identify what the impact has been and, when possible, what the impact will be in Oklahoma, what state policies and actions are affecting the health of those who may come to free/charitable clinics for care. Using the Health Alliance for the Uninsured as one model that is improving access to health care services in central Oklahoma, Pam will share the steps taken and key principles that work.



Providing Victim-Centered, Trauma-Informed Care

Vanessa Morrison, MRCP, Operations Manager for Palomar

Palomar is a comprehensive, multi-disciplinary service model where teams of professionals come together under one roof to provide coordinated services to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, bullying, and human trafficking. Vanessa will share ways in which charitable clinics can adopt processes and systems that are **victim-centered** and **trauma-informed**, resulting in better outcomes for the unique populations we serve.
